## MINUTES OF THE PARISH COUNCIL MEETING HELD AT BENTLEY VILLAGE HALL ON THURSDAY 3 OCTOBER 2019 AT 7.30 PM

Cllr Bamford welcomed everyone to the meeting. The Clerk received no notification of anyone planning to film or record this meeting.

- 2. To receive Declaration of Interest relating to Agenda items: None received

- **4.** To approve minutes of the Parish Council Meeting held on Thursday 5 September 2019. The minutes were approved as a true record and duly signed.

5. Matters Arising from the minutes: Page 981 Checked with Babergh Planning re Notices for Grove Road Application – The erection of the site notice does trigger another 21 days consultation period. However, they do take comments right up until the day that they write the report and decision notice which can be any time between the end of the consultation period to the decision due date (8 weeks after the application is received). Page 982 item 10 – Insurers contacted and 3 year Long Term Undertaking was confirmed with Parish Protect – We have event approval for the Service of Remembrance on 10 November, notices are on the notice boards and the website - Rest will be covered by agenda items.

## **Public Session**

**District Councillor Dave Busby** – Reported that the developer of 1 Grove Road is going to resubmit the planning application for 8 properties instead of 9 to sort out parking. Special meeting is being held on 22 October re re-naming Babergh District Council. He mentioned Sudbury – Bel Vue Housing and Silk Festival. Joint Local Plan consultation has now finished – New swimming pool in Hadleigh (£2.5 million) – now started. The free summer swims were successful and will probably do it again. Visits to Suffolk Energy From Waste – energyfromwaste.co.uk -Lottery funded project – Sporting Moments – videos etc. Police Forum meeting next Wednesday and finally Bentley Family Fun Day went well.

**Resident:** Concerned about the roads through the village flooding – he had rung the Council at least 12-14 times regarding a drain in Church Road.

Cllr Bamford will take a photograph of the drain in Church Road so it can be investigated.

He also felt that pollarding the Lime tree should take place after leaf fall ie between November and March.

- 7. Report by Exception - Tree Warden/Footpath Warden/Capel Library/ Bentley Long **Barn**—Tree Warden – Reported on trees at the Spinney (see item 6 above) Capel **Library**: The stall at Bentley Family Fun Day 8 September selling second hand books at 40 each/3 for a pound did reasonably well. The children's' Reading Game presentation on 15 September attended by County Councillor Gordon Jones went well. New furniture was installed on 16 September. A FOCL Trustees meeting was held on 1 October and the library Community Cinema Risk Assessment was updated. The next event for children is Ollie the Magician on 5 October followed on 9 October by the Book Journey - a book travels from library to library in Suffolk carried in various ways eg from Chantry to Capel by bicycle and from Capel to Hadleigh by bus. Suffolk Library Day 12 October showcases all the library group users who will have a stall to show the public all the extras that the library provides. October 15 Community Cinema film The first Man - a biographical drama leading up to and showing the first moon landing. The final event for October is the Annual Quiz on Saturday 26. **Bentley Long Barn** –No further news. **Footpath Warden:** Reported that posts that have fallen down have been re-erected.
- **8.** Purchase of Chaplet for Remembrance Sunday The Clerk reminded Councillors that the usual donation was £75 because of WW1 celebrations last year £100 had been donated. A donation of £75 was proposed. The meeting was reminded that there will be extra Remembrance Celebrations in May to commemorate V E Day agenda item January.

**9. To discuss St Mary's Church Project:** Councillors had been sent the e-mail from the Treasurer of St Mary's Church and after some discussion it was proposed that Bentley Parish

Council support the bid. The Chairman will liaise with District Councillor Busby and complete the necessary form re CIL grant.

**10. To Review Risk** — Councillors had been issued with a copy of the Risk Assessment which had been changed to incorporate the new Parish Protect Policy — assets had been uplifted by 2%. It was proposed that the document be approved.

11. Withdrawal of subsidy for 94A bus – Update Cllr Munday and District Councillor G Jones had not yet met to discuss and compare data re the 94A. The meeting was told that it has just been announced that Ipswich Buses are withdrawing the 94 Services from 4 November so there will be no buses going through Bentley. District Councillor Busby will raise this issue as part of the Local Plan. It was proposed that the Chairman write a letter to M Evans with a copy to County Councillor G Jones in the strongest possible terms.

- 12. To discuss Play Area Lease The Clerk read out an E-mail from SCC the lease appears to be in place for a 10 year period from October 2014 so would not be looking to renew until 2024. Would likely want to begin discussions a year or so hence to give us the lead in time to agree any aspects of the arrangements and give legal colleagues adequate time to draw up the relevant documentation. There are opportunities to 'break' the lease every two years which is common practice for leases of this nature but SCC have not received any indication that this would be activated by either party. They see no reason not to renew the lease at the end of the current 10 year period unless the school were to become an Academy. A discussion followed about exploring the possibility of purchasing the Play Area.
- **13. GDPR To consider Subject Access Policy** Deferred as the documents re Subject Access Policy and Privacy Policy are still in the process of being circulated to Councillors so a Data Access Policy can be adopted.
- **14. Grit Bins Update** The Clerk reported that 4 forms had been received, Three left to come back as soon as these are received the Grit Bin Request Application form will be submitted to Suffolk County Council.
- **15. Traffic Calming SID pole locations Update** The Clerk informed the Council that now the locations had been agreed and the same exercise as for the grit bins has to be undertaken ie residents have to be contacted and their permission sought to site the pole near to their house.

- **16. Draft Joint Local Plan** Now closed for consultation take of the agenda
- 17. Neighbourhood Plan -Update Cllr Moxey reported that they are waiting for reports to start coming back in had to put some comments back in on the Design Code which was a useful document going to get the Landscape Assessment for the meeting tomorrow night. The Housing Needs Assessment document has been received and Babergh Planning Office approached to discuss the maximum to calculate our joint housing need and what that figure could be 41 or 52? The meeting tomorrow night is to discuss our response. There is a further technical package to apply for to make sure our policies are reasonable and meet the NHP framework. £7K grant allocation not yet spent. Discussing whether to get Ben Elvin involved. There is some light at the end of the tunnel making good progress.
- **18. Quiet Lanes Update -** Cllr Munday reported on making some progress a response had been sent to the Suffolk Green Access Strategy and Rights of Way. A lot of work is involved in designating Quiet Lanes consultation with local people who live on a Quiet Lane Snape initial trial has additional funding which is helping hopefully Babergh and Mid Suffolk have

similar matched funding. Information on Quiet Lanes re A12 and A137 can be used as a policy in the NHP – impact of increasing traffic on our roads – work out a strategy.

- 19. Slide for the Play Area Update In Cllr Feltwell's absence there was nothing to report.
- **20. Affordable Housing Report on progress Update –** Nothing to report. It was explained that Hastoe are taking this forward on the Council's behalf. It was proposed that a meeting be set up with Hastoe to include, Chairman, Clerk and Cllr Moxey. Clerk to arrange.
