
Bentley Annual Parish Meeting Chairman's Report 2025

Review of Bentley Neighbourhood Plan

- Public drop in session on Saturday 8th March
- Well attended with lots of discussion
- Analysis of comments on Parish Council website
- Policies in our plan may need updating
- Housing numbers will need to be confirmed with Babergh
- Full formal public consultation of any proposed changes



Current Major Planning Applications

Solar Farm, Grove Farm –

• Planning permission refused by Babergh on grounds of impact on heritage assets and landscape. The applicant does have the right to appeal.

Brockley Wood Quarry waste processing & concrete crushing –

- Successful claim in the High Court by Bentley PC and a Bentley resident
 - SCC failed to consider the Valued Landscape and the planning permission was quashed.
- Plans have been resubmitted with
 - Additional woodland planting adjacent to the plant site.
 - Weight Restriction on Bentley Hall Road and Church Road to be paid for by the applicant
- Concerns remain over noise and visual impact of the plant site
- SCC meeting on Thursday 24th April to decide on the application

Affordable Housing in Bentley

- Small development of affordable housing being investigated
- Rented and low cost home ownership
- For people with a connection to Bentley
- Parish Council working with Hastoe housing association to find a suitable site outside the village boundary

Traffic Calming - HGVs

- A Weight Restriction has been agreed for Bentley Hall Road/Church Road as part of the Brockley Wood Quarry application
- Bentley PC is working with Suffolk Highways to install "Unsuitable for HGV" signs.



Traffic Calming - Speed Indicator Devices

- 2 SIDs one solar powered and the other battery operated are helping to reduce traffic speeds.
- 85% of traffic travelling at or less than 30 mph as they pass SID.
- More issues with traffic leaving village towards Capel.
- Plans to buy a solar panel for the battery operated SID to save on charging/changing batteries

Traffic Calming – Community Speed Watch

- Our current CSW coordinator has done an excellent job over the past 4 and a half years but is retiring.
- Many thanks to Cliff and his team for all their hard work.



- Planned improvements to this area
- Parish Council working on a "Land for Nature Recovery" scheme with Babergh to replant
- Land cleared thanks to a grant from
 Babergh. Native trees left to flourish.
- Long term project an area people can walk through



Events on Playing Field

- Fireworks Display November
 - Great to see the return of this really popular event.
- Bentley School PTA Summer Fayre
 - PTA organising a Summer Fete to raise funds for the school on Saturday 21st June.
- Maritime FC not continuing but Brantham FC trialling use during the summer.
- Bentley PC have purchased Maritime's pavillion and storage unit using CIL money which can be used for events.

CIL – Community Infrastructure Levy

- Paid by developers 15% paid to parishes but with a NP we get 25%
- For community to improve infrastructure
- Possible to get additional funding from District Council for large project.
